1. Call Meeting to Order

a. Treasurer's Report

This can still be used two more times. (4) There is $\$ 1000$ budgeted for families in need, which might be applied to the $5^{\text {th }}$ grade Winter Sports activity. (5) There was some additional money spent in principal's account, mad money, the science fair, and LAPS fund.

Mhairi has gotten a PayPal dongle to accept credit card payments for yearbooks and tshirts.

The PTA received a Community Asset Award Certificate, which Ramey presented here. Conference lunches are coming up, and there are a few slots left on Thursday. This year we're trying a new school supply company. Supply lists need to be in before March $1^{\text {st }}$.

d. Principal's Report

Last week we participated in NAEP (National Assessment for Educational Progress) testing with $4^{\text {th }}$ grade students. This will be occurring all over the nation over the next 6 weeks - school sites are randomly chosen to be tested. Some students did paper or iPad tests in either reading or math.

Mrs. Guy is thinking about having a parent information night about testing. PARCC testing will be toward the end of the year.

The gagaball pit is now installed in the upper playground. There will be a presentation at 2:30 for the $4^{\text {th }}-6^{\text {th }}$ graders on how to play the game.

Mr. Brown is interested in scheduling a STEM day this year - he did this previously in Santa Fe. He'll provide an outline of available information, and possible dates are March $22^{\text {nd }} 8: 30$ to 12 or March $24^{\text {th }}$.
4. Report of Committees
a. Family Reading Night (Thursday, April 20)

We need to streamline food, books, and materials for Family Literacy and Math Night. To make this clearer, we'll have a meeting about Scholastic dollars, book fair, and money for family reading night. There will be three more meetings before Reading Night, which will help clarify these issues.
